### TAKE THOSE DISPLAYS ON THE ROAD

Share your students' projects and displays! Peer education and community outreach are an important part of this project and a critical way to share information about the environment with others. Students can share their research and data, or created activities, with other audiences:

- Other classes (not participating in Creek Connections)
- Other grades (high school take projects to the elementary school, etc.)
- School board meeting
- Community group (Elks, Kiwanis, city council, senior center, etc.)
- Community event (fair, festival, etc.)
- Ask if you can set up displays at your local library, city hall, church, etc.
- Set them up at your school for all to see (display case, cafeteria, library, administration building)
- Don't forget about next school year's open houses and parents' nights
- And best of all... you and your students should contact and become involved in a **local watershed association or conservation group** (there are lots of them in the region and some even attended the symposium). Working with them might provide some "real life" experiences for your students.
