**Rivers and Harbor Act**

Wetlands and navigable waters are not approved dumping grounds.

**Clean Water Act, Sections 401 and 402**

Protect the state's water quality! Water Quality Certification (Section 401); Discharge pollutants from a point-source (such as a pipe, well, or ditch) into navigable waters? CWA Section 402 Discharge permit

**Coastal Zone Management Act**

If it's near the state's coastline... better get approval!

**National Environmental Policy Act**

Any chance that you could significantly affect the environmental quality?...better write an environmental impact statement.

**Clean Water Act, Section 404**

Dredging or filling in wetlands? Get a Clean Water Act, Section 404 permit from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.

**Endangered Species Act**

Any chance your project might be tampering with the habitat of a federally endangered or threatened species? You'd better visit the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service or National Marine Fisheries Service.

**Wild Resource Conservation Act**

Any chance your project might be tampering with the habitat of a state endangered or threatened species? You'd better visit the DCNR...the Fish Commission or Game Commission.

**Executive Order 11988 – Floodplain Protection**

Protect those floodplains! A federal project constructed on floodplains must get special review.

**Food Securities Act of 1985 – “Swampbuster” provisions**

Converting a wetland to a farm field? Go see the Natural Resource Conservation Service!

**Executive Order 11990 – Protection of Wetlands**

Federal agencies are required to do what it takes to preserve and protect wetlands on federal lands.

**Fish and Wildlife Coordination Act**

If you are requesting a permit to impact wetlands, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service or the National Marine Fisheries Service, as well as the state agency in charge of wildlife management must review your application.

**Transportation Equity act for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century (TEA)**

Any surface transportation project has to check in!

**25 PA Code 105, Dam and Waterway Management**

In PA, if it's construction in and around waterways, you'll find something here that pertains.

**25 PA Code 44, Conservation Areas**
