## Summary of Changes for the April 2024 Honor Code Referendum

- 1. Language has been updated and clarified throughout.
- 2. The Code has been reordered to make clearer sense.
- 3. The Expedited Hearing process is being replaced with a Mutual Agreement process. (Article V.3 new)
- 4. A section about timelines has been added and detail about timelines has been added to the section about appeals (Article V.2 new; Article V.C new)
- 5. Language has been added about gen AI. (Article III.2 revised)
- 6. More language has been added about why academic integrity matters. (Article I.2 new)
- 7. Language more precisely defining what constitutes a proper or accurate citation has been added. (Article III.3 revised)
- 8. Language making clearer the responsibility of faculty to define academic integrity for their individual courses and assignments has been added.

  (Article II.2 new)
- 9. A statement about conflicts of interest for Honor Committee members has been added, which reflects long-standing practice in the committee. (Article V.1 new)
- 10. The language about consultations required for amending the Code has been broadened to include additional constituencies beyond Faculty Council. (Article VIII new)
