


Please note these abbreviations, especially \*IP, which is used to denote a course currently in progress.

#### Repeated Courses

If you repeat a course, you will see two entries on your Degree Audit. The earlier version of the course will appear in the "Other Courses" section with the note "\*RP" for "Replacement Pending." While the replacement attempt is in progress the original credits and grade will not be counted towards the respective totals.



The current class will appear in the appropriate section of the Degree Audit and will be noted as both "\*IP" for "In Progress" and "\*RA" for "Replacement Attempt." Note the different semesters listed under "Term." This is how you may distinguish between attempts.



Regardless of the result of the second attempt, that is what will count towards credits and GPA. This is true if the result is better or worse than the original.

Once the replacement attempt is completed both courses will appear on the Degree Audit without further notation, but only the most recent will be counted towards credit and GPA calculations.
